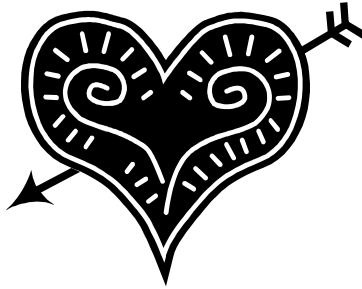

### February Spring Primary Election

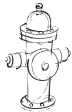

### Voter Registration Information

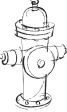
The Village of Reedsville asks voters to bring their Drivers License with them to the polling place if you have not already registered. The federal Help America Vote Act of 2002 (HAVA) and Wisconsin State Statutes require all voters in Wisconsin to be registered in order to vote after January 1, 2006.

**New Water Rates** went into effect December 20, 2010. The first step of the increase is necessary to recover increased operating expenses and plant investment since the utility's last full rate case in 1994. ### **Adopt-A-Hydrant**



The winter months bring a special concern to the Reedsville Fire Department. Winter snowfall with the plowing of snow can often hide fire hydrants under a large amount of snow making them difficult to find quickly. In the event of a fire, firefighters have to locate and shovel out fire hydrants before hooking up to them. Precious time is lost. Please don't let your neighborhood fire hydrant remain "undercover".

The hydrants are normally cleaned out by the Village Street Department, but due to budget and time restraints it can go several days before being cleaned out. We are asking that you help protect yourself and your neighbor by "adopting" the fire hydrant closest to your residence or business and keep it clear of snow.

We need a 3 foot clearance on all sides. When shoveling snow please be aware of vehicle traffic. Do not stand in the street and be careful not to slip and fall out into the roadway.

If you notice a hydrant that needs to be cleaned out, and are unable to "adopt" it, please contact the Village Street Department at 754-4371, so they can take care of it.

## Lifesaving tests you can't afford to miss

Here are some lifesaving medical tests that every woman needs on a regular basis and why.

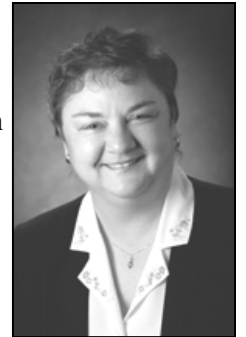
Heart disease is the leading cause of death for American women and claims about 250,000 women's lives a year.

One of the easiest ways to measure heart health is to get a fasting blood test for total cholesterol levels: HDL "good" cholesterol, LDL "bad" cholesterol, and blood fats called triglycerides.

Your health care provider should also test your blood pressure, since high blood pressure is a major risk factor for heart disease. If you have a family history of diabetes or are overweight, a blood sugar test is recommended, too.

The American Cancer Society recommends an annual Pap test until age 30. After 30, if a healthy woman has had three completely normal Pap tests in a row, she can have a Pap test every two to three years (but should still see a health care provider every year for an exam).

Women 40 and older should get a mammogram (breast X-ray) every one or two years. If there is a family history of breast cancer, a woman should get her first mammogram 10 years before her relative was diagnosed. Women older than 50 should have annual mammograms.



Unfortunately, for many women their own health takes a back seat to family responsibilities or their careers. Most women take better care of family members than they do themselves. I encourage my female patients to get regular check-ups and to make time for their own health.

## Transportation Survey

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WISDOT) is inviting Manitowoc County residents to participate in a transportation survey that is designed to identify the transportation habits and needs of older residents. The National Center for Freight & Infrastructure Research & Education at the University of Wisconsin – Madison is conducting the survey.

Participation in the survey is voluntary, anonymous, and confidential. The survey does not ask for the participant's name. The survey is available in either hard copy (paper) or online. You may request a survey from the Aging & Disability Resource Center (ADRC), 4319 Expo Drive, Manitowoc. The paper survey should be returned to the ADRC after completion.

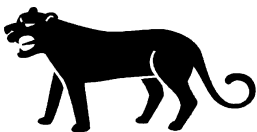
