Notes from the Village Hall

Reminder – Pool Owners: You must document, in writing, the starting and ending meter readings and the dates when filling the pool to qualify for the swimming pool discount.

Open Burning/Fire Pits: All fires must be monitored by a responsible person until the fire has extinguished itself completely. Only clean wood may be used in fire pits and flames cannot extend more than two feet (2') above the pit. Controlled burning must be located off the public street pavement or street gutter, must be at least fifteen (15') from any lot line and may not be less than fifteen feet (15') from any building. Persons utilizing and maintaining outdoor fires shall be responsible for any liability resulting from any damage caused by their fire.

Curfew: Any person under the age of 18 unaccompanied by a parent or legal guardian may not be out and about between 11:00 pm-6:00 am Sunday through Thursday and 12:00am-6:00 am, Friday and Saturday.

Bicycle Registration: All bicycles must be registered. To obtain the license, flag down a Village Police Officer. A \$2.00 fee covers a one-time registration.

4th of July Refuse/Recyclable Pick-up: Refuse and recyclables will be picked up as usual on Friday, July 3rd.

Defecation on Private or Public Property: It shall be unlawful for any person owning or in control of a dog or cat to allow or permit such animal to defecate on any private or public property owned by another person. Violation of this shall be punishable by a forfeiture of anywhere from \$20.00 to \$200.00

Consumer Confidence Report: Copies of the Consumer Confidence Report, water/sewer rate sheet, direct deposit sheet, refuse collection sheet and the June water bill were mailed to all utility customers in a small manila envelope at the end of June. If you have any questions, concerns or need additional copies of any of these sheets, please stop in the Clerk-Treasurer office during normal business hours.

Last installment of your real estate taxes: The Manitowoc County Treasurer, Cheryl M. Duchow, is reminding taxpayers that July 31st is just around the corner and this means the last installment of your real estate taxes is due. Contact the Manitowoc County Treasurer's Office or go to the County website at www.manitowoc-county.com if you are unsure of the amount of taxes due. Along with your check, please mail in the 2nd installment tax stub with your payment to assure that your payment is applied to the correct parcel. Make certain that your payment is postmarked by July 31st. Please include a self-addressed, stamped envelope when requesting a receipt.

Mark's journey began January 5th when he could not catch his breath. We went to Holy Family ER where he was diagnosed with a blot clot in his lung. They quickly transported him to Theda Clark for treatment. There things went from bad to worse. Mark was soon put on a ventilator due to strep pneumonia and was in complete respiratory failure. A few days later his kidneys shut down and dialysis was started.

Sepsis, an infection throughout his whole body, then set in. Now he was in full multi-system failure and chances of survival were very slim. Although he had gone through many procedures, tests and more tests, he kept getting worse. He slipped into a coma and had a fever of 106 degrees for several days. Then they asked the

unimaginable...to stop treatment and keep him on comfort measures only. As a family, Mom, Mari, Mike and I with the help of Lisa

Peters fought to keep going to see if he could fight through one more hour, one more day. On Friday the 13th of February his fever broke and he woke up. Each day after that found him slowly fighting his way back to us. After eight weeks in the ICU he was upgraded to "serious but stable" and

transferred to an acute care facility in West Allis. He spent 10 weeks there to be weaned off the ventilator and for major wound care. Now he has been moved to a subacute care center in Neenah. Here he will have intensive physical therapy and wound care. We have no doubt that Mark will be up and around and on his way back home soon. We continue to pray and stay positive as this is what has gotten Mark and all of us through.

Two things you need to know about cataracts

First, cataracts are an inevitable part of aging—another thing we all have to look forward to, like wrinkles.

Second, cataracts are completely and easily treatable.

A cataract is a clouding of the normally clear lens of the eye, located behind the pupil. The lens focuses light, enabling vision.

As you age, your lenses become thicker, less flexible and less transparent. This makes it difficult for our eyes to focus at close range, hence the need for reading glasses.

Once the lens becomes hard and cloudy, we call it a cataract. Looking through a cloudy lens is like trying to see through a frosty or fogged-up window, making it difficult to read. When these cataracts are removed and replaced with clear, synthetic lenses, our vision becomes young again.

Cataracts usually develop slowly and painlessly, usually affecting those older than 60. The cloudiness may affect only a small part of the lens at first, so you may not even know that you have lost any vision at all.

Signs and symptoms of cataracts include:

- Difficulty driving at night.
- Sensitivity to light and glare.
 - Halos around lights.
- The need for brighter light while reading.
- Frequent changes in eyeglass or contact lens prescriptions.
 - Fading or yellowing of colors.
 - Double vision in a single eye.

In addition to advancing age, other factors that can be associated with developing cataracts include:

- Diabetes.
- Previous eye injury or inflammation.
- Previous retinal or corneal surgery.
- Prolonged use of corticosteroids.
- Excessive exposure to sunlight.
- Radiation therapy and certain chemotherapy.

Early on, stronger lighting and wearing glasses might help you deal with cataract-related vision problems. When your impaired vision begins to impact your lifestyle, it is time to consult an eye doctor.

The only effective treatment for cataracts is surgery to remove the clouded lens and replace it with a clear lens implant. Today, surgical techniques have greatly improved and the risks from cataract surgery are increasingly low.

I strongly recommend that patients do not wait for symptoms to occur and discuss any eye health concerns with your health care provider. Those with a medical condition, such as diabetes, should have regular exams by an eye care professional.

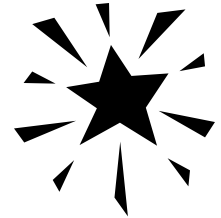
