Village News from the Village Hall

- **Cat & Dog Licenses:** Unspayed females and unneutered males are \$10.00 each. Spayed females and neutered males are \$5.00 each. You must show proof of a valid rabies shot. **A late fee of \$15.00 shall be assessed per dog or cat for failure to obtain a license by April 1, 2012.**
- **April Election:** There will be a spring election on **Tuesday, April 3rd** for Court of Appeals Dist. II, Circuit Court Judge, Branch II, County Board, Village Trustees, and School Board. Polls will be open at the Reedsville Municipal Building, 217 Menasha St., from 7:00 am until 8:00 pm
- **Chipping will done the 1st & 3rd Tuesday in the months of April thru October.** Clean woody vegetative material no greater than six inches (6") in diameter, and not less than four feet (4') in length can be shredded. Lumber (treated and untreated), skids, and other construction and demolition waste can not be shredded. Place near curb with cut ends facing street. If you are interested in the wood chips, the pile is located near the compost area. **Chipping for April will be April 3rd and 17th.**
- **Compost:** Yard waste such as grass clippings, leaves, and yard & garden waste shall be disposed of by composting the material or leaving it at the Village compost site. Items NOT to be put in the compost are: stumps, roots, shrubs with intact root balls, animal waste, and sod. A sign will be erected by the compost that is ready to be used by the public.
- **Garbage Collection Reminder:** "Bulky" items will be picked up on non-recycling weeks only. If an item is too big, too long or too heavy that one (1) person cannot safely load that item into the truck you need to make arrangement for this item to be picked-up. To schedule a pick-up, contact Veolia Environment Services at 920-849-9544.
- **Garbage Collection is limited to two (2) yards per resident per week.** This limit will be enforced by taking 2 yards and leaving the rest at the curb. To schedule an extra pick-up you need to contact Veolia Environment Services at 920-849-9544. The additional expense will be the responsibility of the property owner.
- **Vehicle Nuisance:** It is illegal for any partially dismantled, non-operating, wrecked, junked, unregistered or discarded vehicles to be placed or stored on any public or private property within the Village limits for a period of longer than five (5) days, unless said vehicles are stored within an enclosed building. This ordinance does not apply to property zoned for the sale or repair of vehicles. Having a vehicle behind your garage or under a tarp does not meet the requirement of an enclosed building.
- **Open Book:** The Village of Reedsville Assessment Roll will be available for examination on **April 16, 2012 from 4:00 pm to 6:00 pm** in the hall of the Reedsville Municipal Building, 217 Menasha Street, Reedsville, WI. To schedule a time to discuss an assessment with the Village Assessor, please contact the Village Clerk/Treasurer at 920-754-4371 during normal business hours.

BREAK FREE: NATURAL TOOLS FOR OVERCOMING ADDICTIONS

When most people think of addiction, they immediately think of serious addictions to substances like drugs and alcohol. However, the definition of addiction has been expanded to include psychological dependency on things such as pornography, food, gambling, computers, the internet, gaming, watching TV, work, exercise, shopping and self-injury. Simply put, when we can't stop a behavior that is damaging to ourselves and to others, it is addictive. More than 90% of Americans consume caffeinated beverages daily, and go through severe withdrawal symptoms if they don't get their daily dose of caffeine. If you have a hard time waking up and getting through the day without a cup of coffee, caffeinated soda or an energy drink, you're probably addicted to caffeine. And what about food? Roughly 70% of Americans are overweight and many of us are driven by a need to eat for comfort and pleasure...two classic motivations in addictive behavior. And, if you don't think sugar is addictive, just try giving it up cold turkey and see what withdrawal symptoms you experience. Many addictions are linked to blood sugar problems, so stop eating refined carbohydrates (white sugar, white flour, white rice, corn syrup) and use complex carbohydrates like fresh vegetables, whole fruits, and a moderate amount of whole grains instead. Make sure you get adequate protein for breakfast. To overcome caffeine addiction one needs to strengthen the adrenals and Adrenal Support or Nervous Fatigue Formula are very helpful. These same products can also help with sugar addiction, which is often related to caffeine addiction.

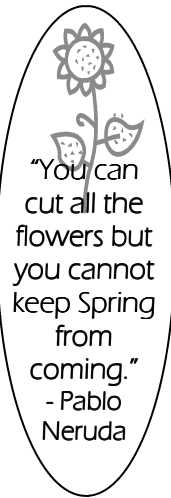

Heart failure: what you need to know

It sounds a little scary. However, with heart failure the heart doesn't actually fail to work — it just doesn't pump blood as forcefully as it should. This eventually reduces blood flow to the kidneys, liver and other organs and allows fluid to build up elsewhere in the body. Heart failure can be caused by many conditions including blocked arteries, a heart attack and other conditions that overwork the heart. There are two types of heart failure. The first type can occur when the heart muscle doesn't contract (squeeze) with enough force, so less oxygen-rich blood is pumped throughout the body. The second type is when your heart doesn't relax well after your heart pumps the blood out. This can raise blood pressure in your lungs. Heart failure is often a "silent" disease. Not all heart failure patients show symptoms such as swollen legs or belly, bulging neck veins, coughing or shortness of breath. That's why it's important to address known risk factors including high blood pressure and diabetes. If you are diagnosed with high blood pressure or diabetes, it is extremely important to see your primary care provider for these problems every 3 to 6 months depending on the severity of the disease. Today health care providers have a number of medical and surgical options to improve a patient's quality of life and reduce death when heart failure is diagnosed. 
