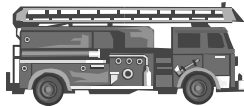

Notes from the Village Hall

Street Closed: Green Meadow Drive, from Park Street to the west 55 yards will be closed Saturday, June 19, 2009 from 6:00 pm until Midnight for the Reedsville Flames Youth Football fund raiser.

Street Closed: Park Street 150 feet south of Manitowoc Street until 150 feet north of Green Meadow Drive will be closed Friday, June 25, 2010 until Sunday, June 27, 2010 for the annual Fire Fighters picnic.

Grass clipping are not to be blown on Village Streets or put into the Creek. Yard waste such as grass clippings, leaves, and yard & garden waste shall be disposed of by composting the material or taking it to the Village compost site.

Operator Licenses: All Operator Licenses expired at midnight on June 30, 2010. If you like to renew your license, please stop at the Village Clerk-Treasurer office during normal business hours to obtain the application. Cost of the license is \$10.00.

Chipping will done the 1st & 3rd Tuesday in the months of April thru October. Clean woody vegetative material no greater than six inches (6") in diameter, and not less than four feet (4') in length can be shredded. Lumber (treated and untreated), skids, and other construction and demolition waste can not be shredded. Place near curb with cut ends facing street. If you are interested in these wood chips, the pile is located near the compost area.

2009-2010 Asbestos Notification

As a result of recent federal legislations, (AHERA), each primary and secondary school in the nation is required to complete a stringent inspection for asbestos and to develop a plan of management for all asbestos-containing building materials. The Reedsville School District has a goal to be in full compliance with this law and is following the spirit, as well as the letter of the law. As a matter of policy, the district shall continue to maintain a safe and healthful environment for our community's youth and employees. In keeping with this legislation, all buildings (including portables and support buildings) owned or leased by the Reedsville School District were inspected by EPA accredited inspectors and samples were analyzed by an independent laboratory. Based on the inspection, the school prepared, and the state approved, a comprehensive management plan for handling the asbestos located within its buildings safely and responsibly.

Furthermore, the Reedsville School District has completed their 3-year reinspection required by AHERA. Our district buildings, where asbestos-containing materials were found, are under repair, removal and operations and maintenance.

This past year Reedsville School District conducted the following with respect to its asbestos containing building materials.

Removal of asbestos floor tile in respect to the renovation of Reedsville High School.

Federal law requires a periodic walk-through (called surveillance) every six months of each area containing asbestos. In addition, the law requires all buildings to be re-inspected every three years after a management plan went into effect. MacNeil Environmental, Inc will accomplish this under contract. Short-term workers (i.e. contractors, repair workers, etc.) must be provided information regarding the location of asbestos in which they may come into contact. All short-term workers shall contact the district's designated person before commencing work to be given this information.

The Reedsville School District has a list of the locations and types of asbestos containing materials found in that school building and a description and timetable for their proper management. A copy of the Asbestos Management Plan is available for review in the school office. Copies are available at 25cents per page. Update on the school updates

Construction

Things are still moving on schedule. The floor has been poured in the Science areas and the floor will be poured in the project shop and ag. shop this week. They will also be constructing the new walls in the project shop and constructing the new hallway between the project shop and the tech. ed. lab this week.

They have begun the major construction in the cafeteria. Two of the six new footings have been dug and poured and two of the footings are waiting to be poured. They are currently in the process of shoring up all of the roof trusses so the section of roof around the new skylight can be cut away and the new structural steel can be put into place. Once the shoring is up, they will begin the removal of the cafeteria walls (with the exception of the wall between the cafeteria and gym).

Most of the construction work has been completed in the south classrooms. They will be working on wall finishes this week. The new ceiling grids will be installed next week however the new ceiling tile and floors will not be installed until sometime over the summer (because of the work on the roof in that area, it was decided not to install the ceiling tiles and new flooring in case of rain and leaking).

Plans are still in place to move the office on June 7 which marks the beginning of phase #4. Phase #4 includes the office area, business classroom, business computer lab, kitchen and gym area.

According to the schedule, we are still on track to finish by the start of the school year.

Creek Relocation

The DNR has posted its 30-day notice for residents affected by the creek relocation. If the DNR doesn't hear any objections during this period, then they have indicated they will give final approval. We have been working with Miron Construction and Point of Beginnings to prepare the bid package for the creek relocation and work that it encompasses.

Reedsville Lions Club Raffle

Other projects that the Reedsville Lions did were to purchase eyeglasses for a Local student in the Reedsville School district because there was a financial hardship. The Lions also purchase other learning aids for students who have sight and hearing disabilities', and sponsor camping scholarships for the blind, deaf, cognitively disabled, and children and young adults with diabetic health issues.

The Reedsville Lions also support Leader Dog of America which is an organization that provides leader dogs to people with sight disabilities free of charge.

Let's celebrate Men's Health Month

June is Men's Health Month — a perfect time to increase awareness of preventable health problems and promote early detection of disease by encouraging men to receive regular medical care and appropriate health and wellness screenings.

So, how can men stay healthy and help prevent disease?

- **Obesity:** Have your body mass index (BMI) calculated to screen for obesity. BMI is a measure of body fat, based on height and weight.
- **High cholesterol:** Have your cholesterol checked regularly starting at age 35. If you smoke, have diabetes, high blood pressure, or if heart disease runs in your family, talk to your health care provider about having your cholesterol checked younger than age 35.
- **High blood pressure:** Have your blood pressure checked regularly. If you need blood pressure medication to control your pressure, take it without fail!
- **Colorectal Cancer:** Starting at age 50, have a colorectal cancer screening. If you have a family history of colorectal cancer, you may need earlier screenings.
- **Diabetes:** Have a test for diabetes, especially if you have high blood pressure or high cholesterol.
- **Depression:** If you feel "down," sad, or hopeless or have little interest or pleasure in doing things, you may be depressed. Talk to your health care provider about being screened for depression.
- **Sexually transmitted infections:** Talk to your health care provider to see if you should be tested for gonorrhea, syphilis, chlamydia, or other sexually transmitted infections including HIV.
- **Abdominal aortic aneurysm:** If you are between 65 and 75 and have ever smoked, you need to be screened once for abdominal aortic aneurysm, which is an abnormally large or swollen blood vessel in your abdomen.

Smoking Cessation: discuss options for quitting with your health care provider.

Other proactive steps for good health:

Smoking: If you still smoke, talk to your provider about quitting.

Aspirin: Ask your provider about taking aspirin to prevent heart disease if you are older than 45 or younger than 45 but have high blood pressure, high cholesterol, diabetes or are a smoker.

Vitamin D3: Take 2,000 IU daily as the "sunshine vitamin" to improve mood, immunity and calcium absorption.

Omega 3 Fish Oil: Take 1,000 mg two times per day. Check with your healthcare provider if you are taking a blood thinner such as warfarin before starting.

Immunizations: Stay up-to-date with your immunizations.

- Have a flu shot every year.
- Have a pneumonia shot once after turning 65. If you have medical problems or smoke, it is recommended you receive this vaccine once before age 65 as well.
- If you are 60 or older, ask about a getting a Shingles vaccine.

Become physically active. If you are not already physically active, start small and work up to 30 minutes or more of moderate physical activity most days of the week.

Eat a healthy diet. Emphasize fruits, vegetables, whole grains, and fat-free or low-fat dairy products, lean meats, poultry, fish, beans, eggs, and nuts. Eat foods low in saturated fats, trans fats, cholesterol, salt (sodium) and limit sugar.

Maintain a healthy weight. To prevent gradual weight gain as you age, make small decreases in food and beverage calories and increase physical activity.

Alcohol in moderation, if you drink. Have no more than two alcoholic drinks per day.

Taking these steps can help you celebrate Men's Health this month and every month for many years to come.
