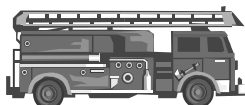

Reedsville High School Grad Returns as Children's Book Author

Joan Zipperer Calder, a Reedsville High School Graduate in 1965, will be reading her children's book, [Airplanes in the Garden Monarch Butterflies Take Flight](#) to students in the summer reading program at Reedsville Elementary Middle School on June 22 at 8:00 a.m. The book will be available for purchase and she will be on hand for book signing after the reading.

[Airplanes in the Garden Monarch Butterflies Take Flight](#) is an easy read book for ages 4 - 8 and is an informative and entertaining book for children and parents. Bonnie, the young girl in this story, guides us through the four week long journey of how caterpillars in her garden become monarch butterflies. Captivating and imaginative watercolor artwork, depicting the life of a caterpillar, keeps a child's attention while the story teaches the child (and parent) what a caterpillar requires to become a butterfly.

Calder, author, horticulturist, and garden designer, manages the campus greenhouse for ecology, evolution and marine biology at the University of California, Santa Barbara. Calder teaches garden design classes for the Santa Barbara City College continuing education program. She graduated from the University of Wisconsin with a BA in social work and received an AS degree in ornamental horticulture from Foothill College in Los Altos Hills, California. New Trees in the Village

The Village of Reedsville was awarded a grant from the DNR to purchase trees to plant on public property within the village. Due to the donations of equipment, supplies and materials we were able to complete the project on May 7th.

Nine different species were planted including English oak, swamp white oak, Japanese lilac, ginkgo, Kentucky coffee tree, Turkish filbert, State Street maple, katsuratree, and serviceberry.

The following individuals/organizations made the project a success: Bill Lorrigan Construction - use of a bobcat, Mike Hutterer's NEW Tree Service - stump grinding, Vande Hey Landscape Company - use of a dump truck, equipment, and supplies, Village of Reedsville - use of a tractor and tree stakes, Reedsville Lioness and Reedsville Corner House - lunch for the volunteers, and over 40 volunteers who donated their time and talents to make sure the trees were planted properly. It will be fun to watch them grow into beautiful trees. Due to a wet spring and the confusion that may result from several people watering the trees, it is recommended that no one waters the trees unless asked to do so.

Over 50? Get screened today!

Colorectal cancer is the second leading cause of death from cancer in the United States, with this silent killer claiming more than 50,000 lives each year.

Research shows that a high percentage of colorectal cancers could be avoided if people over 50 had regular screening tests. Yet despite the benefits, fewer than half of Americans 50 or older have been screened for colorectal cancer.

Common signs of colon cancer include a change in bowel habits or blood in the stool, but these same symptoms may be caused by other medical conditions as well.

Aurora Health Care recommends that all men and women age 50 and older be screened for colon cancer. Colonoscopy is the screening method of choice and is recommended every 10 years. Colorectal cancer can be avoided by removing any pre-cancerous polyps (growths) found in the colon during a colonoscopy.

Those at higher risk for colorectal cancer or with a family history of the disease may need to have these tests done earlier and more often.

There can be lots of reasons *not* to be screened for colon cancer — such as the time involved, the possible costs, and the advance preparation needed.

There is, however, one excellent reason to do it - it can actually save your life. So, if you (or someone you love) is 50 or older, please get screened today!
