Notes from the Village Hall

April Election

There will be a spring election on Tuesday, April 5, 2010 for Supreme Court Judge, Village President & Trustees and School Board. Polls will be open at the Reedsville Municipal Building, 217 Menasha St., from 7:00 am until 8:00 pm.

Absentee Voting: A qualified elector who is unable or unwilling to appear at the polling place on election day may vote by absentee ballot.

An elector who is indefinitely-confined because of age, physical illness or infirmity or is disabled for an indefinite period may sign a statement to that effect and a ballot will automatically be sent for every election until such time as the elector fails to return a ballot.

If you would like to vote as an absentee voter, contact your Municipal Clerk and request an absentee ballot application. You must be a registered voter.

Cat & Dog Licenses are due on or before April 1st. Unspayed females and unneutered males are \$10.00 each. Spayed females and neutered males are \$5.00 each. You must show proof of a valid rabies shot. **Failure to obtain a license by April 1st, will result in a late fee of \$15.00 per pet.**

Direct Deposits for Utility Bills: You can have your utility payment deducted automatically from your checking or savings account. Forms can be picked up at either the Village Clerk-Treasurer office or the Denmark State Bank - Reedsville.

Clerk/Treasurer's Office Hours: Monday thru Friday, 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM. Office is located at the Reedsville Municipal Building, 217 Menasha Street.

Recycling Pick-Up: March 11th & 25th, 2011

Water Softeners: Any water softener installed after March 15, 2010, must be rated to have a salt efficiency of at least 4000 grains of hardness removed per pound of salt used, must be approved and inspected by a representative of the Village of Reedsville and must regenerate on demand only.

Adults need vaccines, too!

Throughout the lifespan, adults need immunizations to protect against flu, tetanus, chickenpox, pertussis, shingles, pneumonia, HPV and other diseases.

For example, Pertussis (whooping cough) is making a big comeback since reaching an all-time low in the 1970s. The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) recommends that all adults get a pertussis booster shot to strengthen their immunity.

If you receive a regular tetanus-diphtheria (Td) booster every 10 years as recommended, you won't need an extra shot for pertussis. Vaccine makers have added a pertussis component to that booster (Tdap vaccine).

The measles, mumps, rubella (MMR) vaccine is important, too. Check with your health care provider to see if you need a MMR booster.

Here are other vaccines adults may need:

- Pneumococcal (pneumonia) vaccine is recommended by the CDC for adults 65 years and older.
 - HPV (human papillomavirus) vaccine – the CDC recommends three doses for females through age 26.
 - Varicella (chickenpox) vaccine – Adults without evidence of immunity to varicella should receive two doses of single-antigen varicella vaccine, if not previously vaccinated.
 - The same virus that causes chickenpox causes shingles. A shingles vaccine (Zostavax) can help protect those age 60 and older.
- And finally, adults who wish to avoid the flu and complications should get an annual flu vaccination. In general, anyone six months or older can benefit from the protection offered by a flu vaccine.

For that reason, separate camping sessions are set aside for children with visual, hearing or mild cognitive disabilities and children with type I and type II diabetes. Each program is geared to meet the goals and objectives of the camp for each camper on an individual basis. Participation is limited to residents of Wisconsin.

While safety and proper instruction are an important part of all camp activities, fun and enjoyment are the key elements that run throughout the total camp program. The program provides opportunities for children to grow in their interests live and interact successfully with others and foster self-confidence and independence. Typical camp activities include swimming, canoeing, sailing, paddle boating, inner tubing, kayaking, rowing, fishing, archery, crafts, nature programs, sports and games, overnight camping and cookouts, canoe trips, hiking trips, challenge courses and much more! All program activities are targeted to the child's abilities and are paced accordingly to provide each camper with a memorable experience at the Wisconsin Lions Camp.
