**Lifestyle choices can improve
blood pressure**

Medical researchers agree that reducing salt, eating lots of fruits and vegetables, exercising and maintaining a healthy weight can all help control high blood pressure.

Health care professionals often recommend the DASH diet for people diagnosed with high blood pressure. DASH stands for Dietary Approaches to Stop Hypertension. This diet plan offers a basic, healthy eating plan filled with fruits and vegetables, whole grains, nuts, legumes, low-fat dairy products and fatty fish such as salmon.

Having an occasional alcoholic drink may lower blood pressure temporarily, but excessive alcohol consumption contributes to hypertension. Moderation is key.

What about exercise? A new study found that aerobic exercise, strength training and even isometric handgrip exercises all reduce systolic (the higher number) blood pressure numbers by two to 10 points.

Taking your blood pressure on a regular basis will let you know how you are doing. A digital blood pressure cuff is easier to manage than a manual cuff. Digital cuffs cost from \$25 to more than \$100, depending on the features.

Blood pressure numbers lower than 120/80 are considered a normal, healthy reading. Higher numbers (up to 139/80) suggest pre-hypertension.

A reading of 140/90 signals hypertension, which could progress to 160/100 or even higher, if left untreated.

If your blood pressure reading is consistently above normal, please contact your health care provider for advice and possible treatment.

VITAMIN B6 (PYRIDOXINE)

Pyridoxine is also known as vitamin B6. This water-soluble vitamin is a member of the B vitamin complex. This vitamin is needed for more than 100 enzymes involved in protein metabolism so the more protein you eat, the more you need. The skin and nervous system need vitamin B6 to function efficiently and it also helps maintain your blood glucose within a normal range.

MEDICATIONS THAT DEplete VITAMIN B6 (PYRIDOXINE):

Heart rhythm/fibrillation medication, oral contraceptives, estrogen, hormone replacement therapy, diuretics, Parkinson's medication, barbituates, seizure medication, and asthma medication.

EFFECTS OF DEPLETION OF THIS VITAMIN INCLUDE: depression, sleep disturbances, nerve inflammation, pre-menstrual syndrome (PMS), lethargy, decreased alertness, altered mobility, anemia, elevated levels of homocysteine (which can lead to heart disease), nausea, vomiting and dermatitis.

TOP SOURCES OF PYRIDOXINE:

1 banana = .6mg.

3 oz. chicken breast = .5 mg.

1 medium baked potato = .4 mg

3 oz. baked bluefish = .4 mg.

Manitowoc County offers a wonderful service to eligible individuals that many may not be aware of, a delicious, hot home delivered meal. Home Delivered Meals are available anywhere in the County. In Reedsville and its surrounding areas meals can be delivered up to 5 days a week. Eligibility guidelines are as follows:

- A person aged 60 years of age or older who is frail and essentially homebound (does not leave home under normal circumstances, flexibility is allowed for appointments), or a spouse of an eligible person regardless of age or condition.
- A disabled individual who resides at home with an eligible older individual participating in the program.

A dining site is also located at the Reedsville Manor Apartments where meals are served Monday through Friday to anyone 60 years of age or older and their spouse regardless of age. Meals are available to all qualifying individuals on a donation basis regardless of income.
